

Issues - Program List (October 10, 2008)

As required quarterly by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), this Issues and Program List will identify the programs aired over WETD 90.7 FM, State University of New York, Alfred, NY 14802 over the preceding quarter (July 10, 2008 – Oct 9, 2008). In order to fulfill part 73.3527 of Title 47 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR) regarding non-commercial, educational radio stations, WETD 90.7 FM is required by the Federal Communication Commission (FCC) to submit a Quarterly List reflecting the “*licensee’s most significant programming treatment of community issues*”. The Issues – Program List must be filed in the Public Inspection File each quarter (On January 10th, April 10th, July 10th, and October 10th.)

WETD 90.7 FM is owned by The State University of New York (SUNY). Alfred State College’s (ASC) President, Dr. John M. Anderson, and the ASC President’s Counsel currently oversee the daily operations of the radio station. WETD is funded and operated as an ASC Student Senate-funded club.

WETD continues to seek to determine definitely what issues are affecting our community, and provide serious treatment for our listeners within the FCC defined guidelines for Issues and Programming Lists. The BOD continues to work towards this by conducting the Community-wide survey concerning what are the most significant issues that affect our listener’s lives. There are several clear areas, most notably personal finance and personal relationships. WETD is looking at all identified areas in this survey for adding need-specific programming for our listeners.

The main programs on the Issues & Programming list are **The Health Show, 51%**, and **The Best of our Knowledge**.

1. **The Health Show** is a nationally syndicated public radio program produced by the National Productions unit at [Northeast Public Radio](#). The program covers all aspects of modern health: prevention, treatment, research, administration and more. Each week *The Health Show* breaks the issues down so you can be a better informed patient or care-provider.

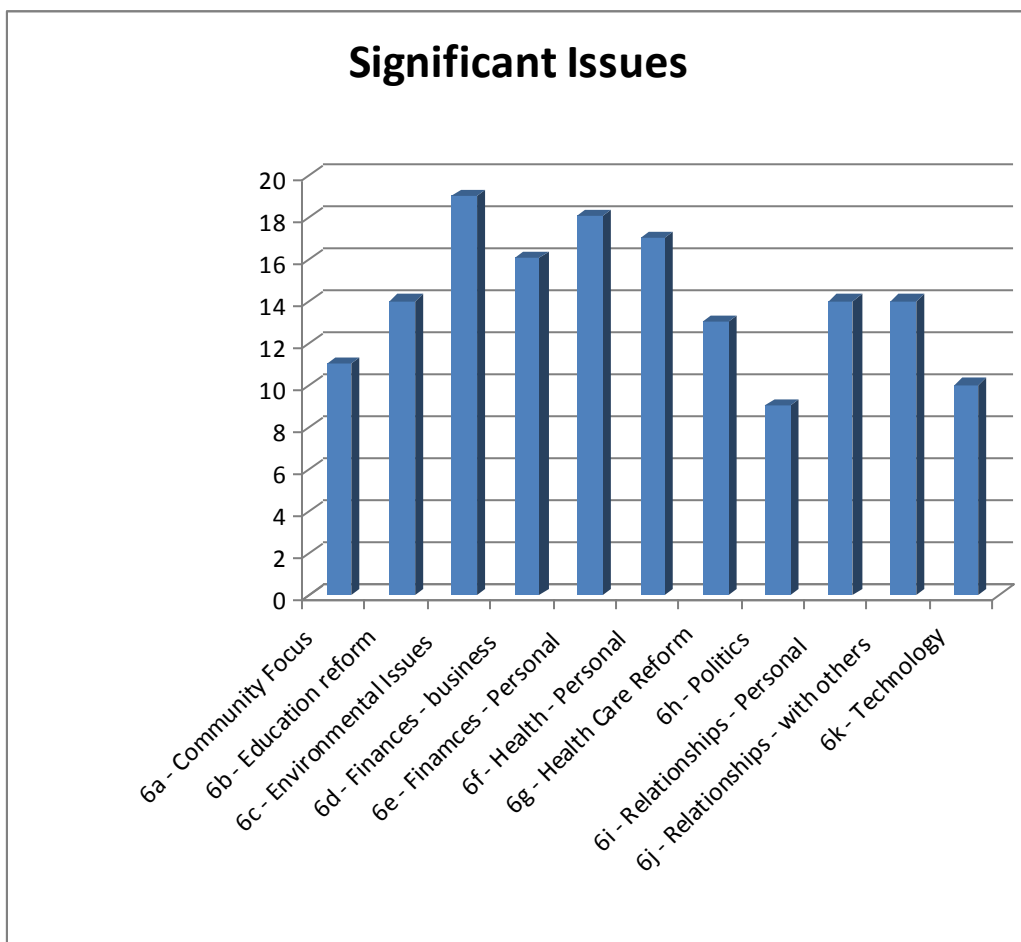

WETD Identified Issues

Overview: In order to identify the most significant issues facing our listeners, WETD conducted an annual listener survey. Based on these results and previous surveys, WETD is committed to providing the best programming in meeting the most significant identified issues of our community.

During Hot Dog Day weekend, April 2008, WETD conducted a listener survey involving a broad survey sample of residents from throughout our listening area, as well as students, staff and faculty from both Alfred University & Alfred State College. Based on this survey, WETD staff has identified that environmental issues was the most significant issue facing our listeners, followed by personal finances and personal health.

In reviewing our current programming, WETD continues to provide programming that meets these needs, as well as considering others as well in meeting these needs,
